The Norwegian Environment Agency is a government agency under the Ministry of Climate and Environment. The Norwegian Nature Inspectorate (SNO) manages field operations as part of the Environment Agency. SNO safeguards the natural environment and prevents environmental crime. Its responsibilities include inspection and monitoring, operative management of important protected areas, and information and dissemination of environmental knowledge.

SNO also works with active wildlife management, in particular large carnivores and vulnerable, threatened and alien species. This work includes population monitoring and registration, reintroduction of extinct or nearly extinct species, documentation of injuries to livestock and reindeer, and culling of carnivores to reduce livestock losses.

SNO's headquarters are in Trondheim with a further 60 local offices across the country.
